History Detectives (Key Stage 1, 2, 3)

Calling all curious minds! In this exciting session, children will become history detectives—investigating real castle artefacts, using their historical skills, and uncovering clues about life in the past.

This hands-on workshop gives young participants the chance to examine genuine historical objects up close. Through guided exploration and discussion, they'll uncover the stories these artefacts have to tell.

Create Your Own Stained-Glass Window (Key Stage 1 & 2)

Step into the colourful world of stained glass! In this fun and creative workshop, children will design their very own stained-glass window, using colours that reflect their personality and imagination.

An engaging introduction will reveal how colours were used in stained-glass windows to convey powerful meanings. Then, it's time to get hands-on—children will choose their colours and create unique designs to take home.

Create Your Own Coat of Arms (Key Stage 1, 2 & 3)

Discover the world of knights and noble families! In this exciting workshop, children will design their very own coat of arms, just like the knights of old, using colours and symbols to represent who they are.

The session begins with an introduction to the meanings behind the colours, animals, and symbols on a coat of arms. Then, children will create their own unique emblems - perfect for showcasing their personal identity and values.
